6. Listen to a song or watch an advertisement from a sponsor. What is the slogan or what are they selling?

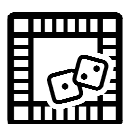
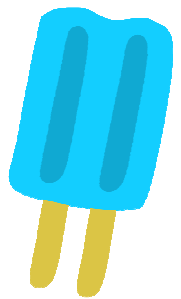


7. Create a craft that represents the games. Examples include: decorate a t-shirt, create a paper flag, OR make a craft from the country that is hosting the games.

Where are the World Soccer tournament Games this year?

Russia is the place where the soccer games take place this year. The games happen every 4 years. Color the map and flag below to learn more about them.



Russia is the largest country in the world and is located on the Europe an a Asian continents. It is about 4,000 miles wide.

The **Capital** of Russia is Moscow. It borders the Arctic Ocean on the north, the Pacific Ocean on the west. The most common terrain in Russia is tundra, forests, and steppes. Tundra permafrost, frozen ground, and is frozen solid for most of the year and only thaws in the summer.

Coloring Directions:

The **Russian flag** has three stripes. It was adopted on August 21, 1991. It consists of three equal horizontal bands of white (on the top), blue and red (on the bottom). Since 1994, Russia celebrates national "Day of State Flag" on the 21st of August each year.

World Soccer Themed Card Games

World Soccer Memory Card Game

Located on pages 5-12 are memory cards to **color** and **cut out and glue on index cards or colored paper to prevent seeing the image through the card.**

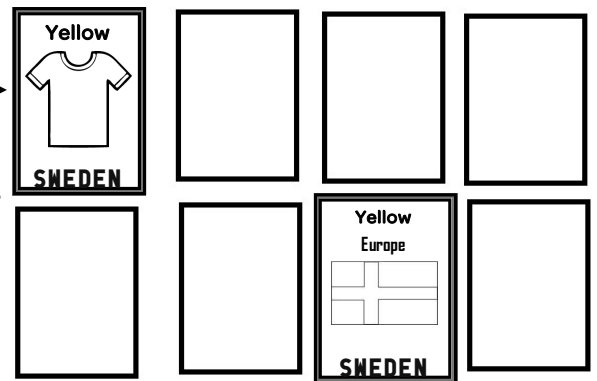
If you print them on cardstock, a thicker paper, you don't have to glue them on index cards.

- **There are two cards for each country.** You don't have to color the cards but the participant will learn a lot about the jersey and the flag per country when researching and coloring the card. Use the below link to view all team jerseys.

- **Color the jersey cards according to the name of the color on the card.** This could either be their away or home jersey.
- **Color the flag cards** according to the colors noted on the flag. All items with no color noted leave white.
- **Cut out and glue on index cards or colored paper.**

The game is best played two players so they can take turns finding the matches. See example to the right.

If you have a large group, you can make several copies of the cards or divide the cards up into 2 groups so you can create more than one game. There are 32 countries participating in the games so there are 64 cards to play with.

The players will shuffle the cards face down. Now lay them on a table face down one at a time. First player tries to find a match. They need to match the countries. One will have a jersey and the other card the flag. Both cards will have the country name on it.



The player continues to play as long as they are making matches. When they don't match it becomes the other players turn. The player with the most matches at the end wins.

World Soccer Knock Out Game

Games Cards (pages 5-12)

Soccer Lingo (pass, score, knock out)

Color the cards and assemble as instructed above.

The game is best played with 3-4 team players. Each person is given five cards, the remainder is placed in a deck face down. The first player begins by asking for a match to anyone playing. If they do not have a match then they say "pass". The player draws a card from the deck. If they receive a match from a player or the deck then they lay it down in front of them. They "score". The first person that goes out with no cards in their hand wins a "knock out".

Knock out: If one team knocks out another team, they beat them. After this the losing team can no longer play in the tournament.

Pass: To kick the ball to another player on your team.

Score: The recorded number of goals that shows us who is winning the match.



World Soccer Themed Card Games

Show Your True Colors Card Game

Located on the next few pages are cards to print on cardstock, **color** and **cut out**.

- Make **TWO copies** of each page of cards. (pages 5-13)
- You don't have to color the full card but you need to **color the top of the card** where the color is noted.
- On page 13, there are special cards you can use to make the next player: Draw 2, skip, reverse the direction of the playing order or change the color.
- Please note there are **more red and blue colored cards than yellow and green**.
- **All white jersey cards are wild cards. Dark blue, light blue and blue are all considered blue.**

The object of the game is to be the first player to use all of their cards. There are action cards (Skip, Draw Two, wild and Reverse) The deck consists of 144 cards if you copy them twice. Colors are red, green, blue, white and yellow. All white cards are considered wild cards.

To start, seven cards are dealt to each player, with the top card of the deck flipped over to begin the discard pile. The player to the dealer's left plays first. If the first card on the discard pile is an action or Wild card take it and place it back in the pile.

On a player's turn, they must do one of the following: Play a card matching the discard in color, draw the top card of the deck, or complete the action noted on the card.

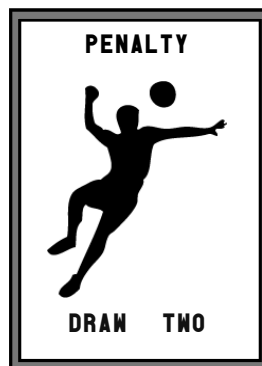
A player who draws from the deck must either play or keep that card, and may play no other card from their hand on that turn.

A player may play an **action card at anytime**, even if that player has the color on the pile.

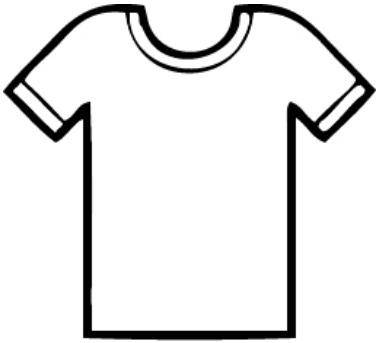
If the entire deck is used during play, the top discard is set aside and the rest of the pile is shuffled to create a new deck.

Play then proceeds normally until someone loses all their cards.

ACTION CARD	EFFECT WHEN PLAYED
SKIP (Handball)	Next player in sequence misses a turn
REVERSE (tackle)	Order of play switches directions (clockwise to counterclockwise, or vice versa)
DRAW TWO (penalty)	Next player in sequence draws two cards and misses a turn
WILD CARD (Substitute) (white Card or wild)	Player determines the next color to be matched (may be used on any turn even if the player has matching color)

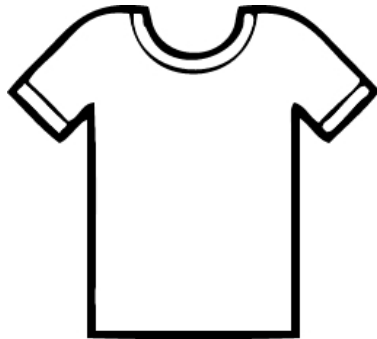

Russia Crafts

Matryoshka Dolls- A traditional Russian toy is the nesting dolls set called matryoshka dolls. They are hollow wooden dolls that nest inside each other. Christmas is the traditional time they are received.

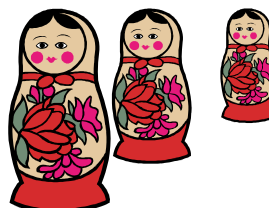


Templates located in the back of this manual

 scissors
 cardstock, file folder, or 6 X 9 envelope

There is a variety of sizes of the Matryoshka located in the back of this manual. The participants can nest them together by placing them inside and envelope or pocket. Glue the largest doll on a pocket and place the remainder of the dolls inside. Color and decorate the dolls with flowers and patterns on their dresses. If you are interested in creating a pocket of nesting dolls, glue the largest doll on the front of the pocket and back of the doll on the back. This creates a pocket to place the remainder of dolls inside. Write MATRYOSHKKA DOLLS on the outside.

Matryoshka Dolls- Create dolls using different sized paper cups that nest together.

 glue and glue stick
 1 small, med, and large paper cups that nest together.
 construction paper
 stickers are optional

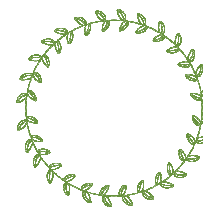


Purchase or use cups in sizes of 8 oz, 6 oz, and 4 oz. These sizes should nest inside each other. Cut the construction paper background to fit around the cup for a background. Glue or tape on the cup. You can also leave it blank. Another option is to purchase colored cups. Have each person write their name on the bottom of their cups. Color the templates and cut them out. Place the cup upside down, bottom up. Then glue the template on the outside cups. Let dry and nest them together.



Easy Ribbon Head Wreath

Scissors
 Pipe cleaners (4 for each wreath)
 Ribbon in assorted colors, 1/2 inch wide (sold at craft stores by the roll)



Take one pipe cleaners and twist them together. (do this twice) Now twist one end of each pipe cleaner together. Place on top of the persons head for measurement. Complete the circle by twisting the last two ends together. Cut four pieces of ribbon, each piece should be 24 inches long. Fold it in half and tie it to the back of the wreath covering the area where you twisted the ends together.

Russia Recipes

Potato Pancakes- Potatoes are a popular staple in Russia. These are easy and fun to make.

1 bag of hash browns found in the refrigerator section
 1/3 c. all-purpose flour
 1 egg
 1 tsp. salt
 Vegetable oil
 Applesauce (optional)



In medium bowl, place 2 3/4 cups of hash browns, flour, egg, and salt. Stir together until mixed well. Place vegetable oil in the frying pan until warm. Place the batter into the skillet about the size of a 4 inch pancake. Cook until browned on both sides, about 5 minutes. Drain on paper towels. Place on warm platter; to keep warm. You may serve pancakes with applesauce. Makes 10.

Cabbage Turnovers- Russians eat cabbage almost everyday in many forms.

2/3 cup of onion, chopped
 2 cups of shredded cabbage or coleslaw mix
 1 tablespoon of brown sugar
 1 teaspoon of vegetable oil
 1 tablespoon of brown sugar
 1 teaspoon of lemon juice
 1 teaspoon of dill
 Dash of salt and pepper to taste
 1 can of refrigerated buttermilk biscuits (usually has 10 biscuits inside)
 rolling pin, waxed paper, and baking sheet

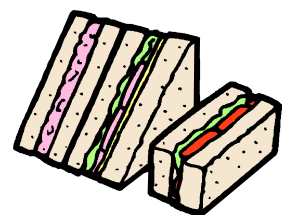


Place vegetable oil in frying pan on medium heat. Add chopped onion and shredded cabbage or coleslaw mix. Stir until vegetables are coated with oil. Add brown sugar, lemon juice, dill, pepper and salt. Cook until vegetables are tender, about 7 minutes. Remove from heat and preheat oven to 400 degrees. To make the crust of turnover place a biscuit on the waxed paper and cover with another piece of wax paper. Begin rolling out the biscuit until it is about 4 inches wide. Remove from wax paper and place a spoonful of cabbage mixture in the center of the biscuit and fold it over. Use a fork and seal the edges. Place the turnover on the baking sheet. Continue this process with the remainder of biscuits. Cook for 8-10 minutes or until golden brown. Serve warm.

Zakuski - Zakuska is a Russian term used for an assortment of cold or hot appetizer dishes consumed before the proper meal, similar to a buffet table spread.

Items served

Canapés are open faced sandwiches
 bite size **sandwiches** (cheese, cold cuts, boiled eggs)
salads- fresh green lettuce with carrots, cucumbers etc. or fruit salads
cooked vegetables (potato, carrots, sauerkraut, marinated mushrooms etc.)
baked and chilled vegetables: pumpkin, squash, tomato, spinach, onion etc.
 Cold **fish** and shellfish served hot or cold
cold cuts- sausages, ham, roast beef, etc.
 a variety of **cheeses** are served sliced, arranged on serving plate.
hot meats-hamburgers, lamb, veal, and meatballs of different shapes and sizes
Cold and hot desserts -pancakes with jam, mousses, ice cream, and puddings
beverages like iced water, soft drinks or natural fruit juices, coffee and tea

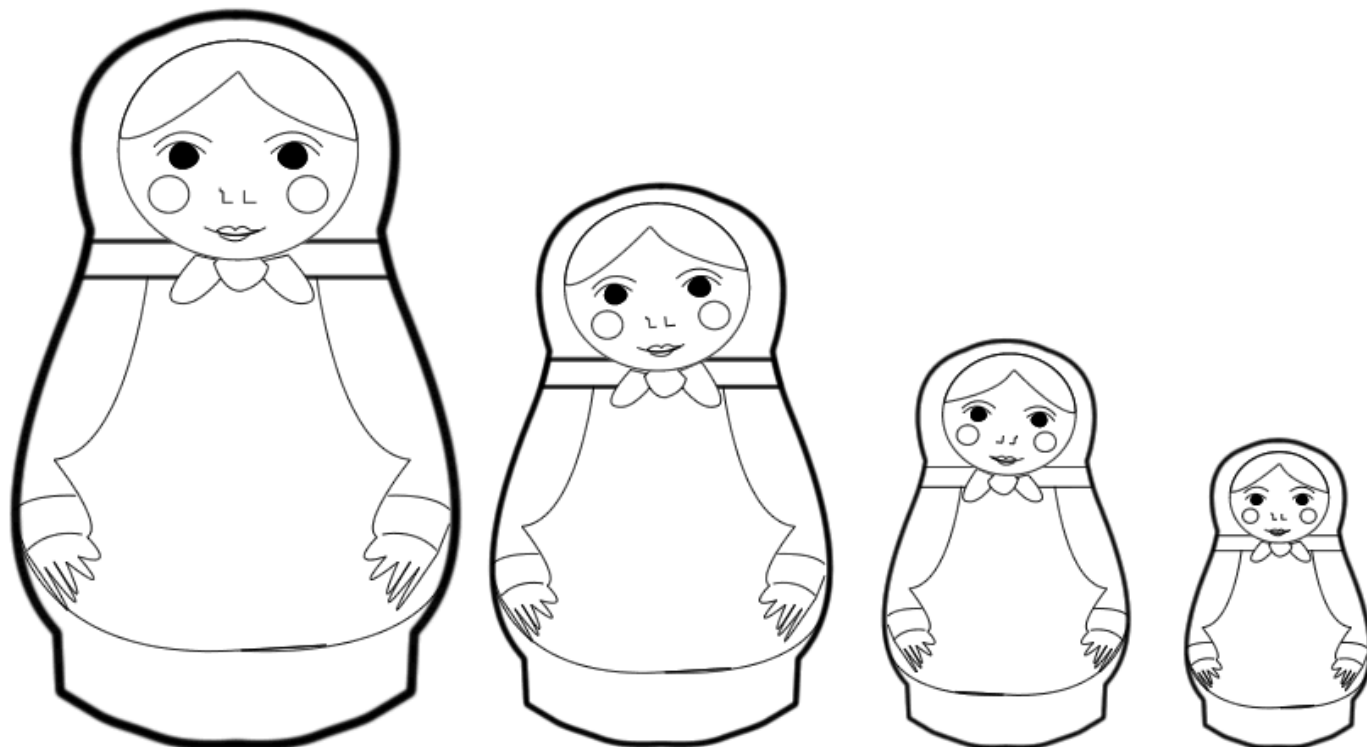
