


Because I am a princess, I don't go to regular school. Instead, I am tutored inside my house, and I have a few different tutors that teach me about different subjects. I wish I could go to regular school, but my parents won't let me. I also have to attend "tea time" everyday where we practice our manners and eat small sandwiches and drink tea.

In addition, I am not allowed to go outside of the palace alone. There are always guards outside of the castle protecting it so that no bad people or trespassers can get in. They have high, black, furry hats and bright red coats. Even if you make funny faces or tell jokes, they don't laugh. In fact, they look like big toy soldiers!



One time I was able to sneak out of the castle and visit the town square. In the town square I saw the market and entertainers. There were a lot of pretty and delicious looking things for sale and there were also some jesters, minstrels, and gypsies that were performing plays, singing songs, dancing, and doing tricks. There were also many children dancing around a *maypole* and celebrating May Day—that's why there was so much commotion in the town square. It was amazing! Sometimes I am able to go see plays in big theatres with the royal court, but those aren't as fun as the groups I saw in the town square.

Recipes

Chocolate Dipped Fruits and Pretzels-Choose a variety of items to dip in yummy chocolate.

1 package of chocolate melts
 forks, kabob sticks, etc to use for dipping.
 pretzels, strawberries, and other fruits dip in chocolate
 wax paper, paper plates
 Optional: Little gift bags, boxes, ziploc bags to place items in.

Melt the chocolate according to the back of the package. The items do not have to be completely covered with chocolate. Prepare these items for an English tea party or allow 2-3 people to dunk their items at a time. Give each participant a piece of wax paper, a utensil, and their selected items to dip in chocolate. Mark their name on the waxed paper with a permanent marker. Place the wax paper over the paper plate. This is where they will place their items as they dip them in the chocolate. No double dipping, finger licking etc. As they dip each item, they place it on their plate and continue with the next item. After they are cooled, they can eat them or place them in a ziploc bag.

Cucumber Sandwiches

1 loaf white bread (trim crust from bread)
 1 stick butter at room temperature
 3 or 4 cucumbers, peel cucumbers and thinly slice



Take 2 slices bread and spread the cream cheese on one side of the bread. Cover with a layer of cucumber. Top with another slice of bread, pressing down gently. Cut into squares and serve with tea or other treats.

Snickerdoodles

3/4 cup of sugar
 1/2 cup of butter
 2 eggs
 2 cups of flour
 1/4 cup of sugar
 1 tsp of vanilla

Cinnamon topping: 1/2 cup of sugar mixed with 2 teaspoons of cinnamon.

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Mix 1/2 cup sugar and 2 teaspoons of cinnamon in a bowl, set aside. Soften butter in microwave or stovetop. Combine eggs, butter, and vanilla in a mixing bowl. Blend in 3/4 cup sugar. Gradually add flour, 1/2 cup at a time. Roll into 1 inch balls. Roll balls in the cinnamon sugar mixture.

Place on ungreased baking sheet, 2 inches apart. Bake 8-10 minutes, or until golden brown. Remove from baking sheet and place on cooling racks.

Hopscotch- A 10 square board-(hopping) Hopscotch began in Britain.

Chalk

sidewalk, driveway, or playground

markers (rocks)

Each player has a marker, usually a common stone that you can mark with a marker if you wish to make each participants stone unique. The first player tosses his or her marker into the first square and every player afterwards continues the same pattern.

The marker must always land completely within the designated square without touching a line or bouncing out. If the marker lands in the wrong square, the player forfeits his turn and must start at that square their next turn. This could get tricky for younger children and you may wish to bend the rules a little and let them drop it down on the correct square.

If the toss is successful, the player hops through the court beginning at square one. Side by side squares are straddled, with the left foot landing in the left square and the right foot in the right square. Single squares must be hopped into on one foot. Squares marked number 10, heaven, or 1, home, are the starting and ending marks of the game and are "Safe" or neutral squares and may be stepped on in any manner without a penalty.

When the player reaches the number 10, he or she turns around and hops back through the court, hopping through the squares in reverse order and stopping to pick up his/her marker on the way back. Upon successfully completing the sequence, the player continues his/her next turn by tossing his marker into square two and continuing in a similar fashion until all the blocks are completed.

If, while hopping through the hopscotch squares in either direction, the player steps on a line, misses a square, or loses his balance and falls, his/her turn ends. He/She does not get credit for completing that turn and must start at that number their next turn. First player to complete one course for every numbered square wins.

VARIATIONS: Create longer boards and more safe or neutral areas for resting stations.

Quoits-similar to ring toss. You can purchase a ring toss at the local dollar store. Otherwise create your own by using the following items.

Wooden stake

Rings to toss (about 6 inch in diameter) (4 for each palyer or team)

Place the stakes 18 yards apart and secure them in the soll. Begin tossing the rings on the wooden dowels about 6 yards from the stake.

Points:

The first player or team of players to reach 21 wins.

A Ringer around the stake it is worth 3 points.

A ring that leans against the stake is worth 1 point.

Princess Wreath



Silver and gold pipe cleaners (4 for each wreath) OR pre-designed wire garland

Ribbon in assorted colors (about 1/4 inch wide)

Ribbon sold at craft stores for \$.50 or \$.99 a roll

Take one silver and one gold pipe cleaner and twist them together. (do this twice) Now twist the two together. Place on top of the persons head for measurement. Complete the circle by twisting the last two ends together. Cut four pieces of ribbon, each piece 24 inches long. fold it in half and tie it to the back of the wreath, secure with a knot.

Beautiful Castle



Craft foam or construction paper (gray and black)

Cardboard box (about 4 inches tall and 6-8 inches wide and deep)

4 toilet paper tubes (2 paper towel tubes cut in half)

scissors


tape and glue (hot glue works best on the craft foam)

Optional: Green shrubs or other greenery toothpicks and scrap paper for flags on the turrets

If you would like your castle to be larger you can use a larger box and uncut paper towel tubes.

Cover the tubes completely with the gray foam or construction paper. Wrap the paper around the box allowing about 1 1/2 inch of paper at the top to cut out the castle top as shown.



After the pattern is cut out glue or tape the paper to the box. Make cones out of black or dark gray to cover the top of the covered tubes. In order to make cones, you take a rectangular piece of construction paper and roll it into a cone shape.





Cut out small squares for windows or arched shaped windows out of black foam or paper. The door should be arched shaped cut out of black foam or paper.

Glue all the items on the castle and add all the extra optional items.






















