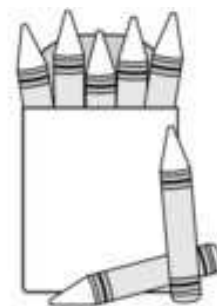
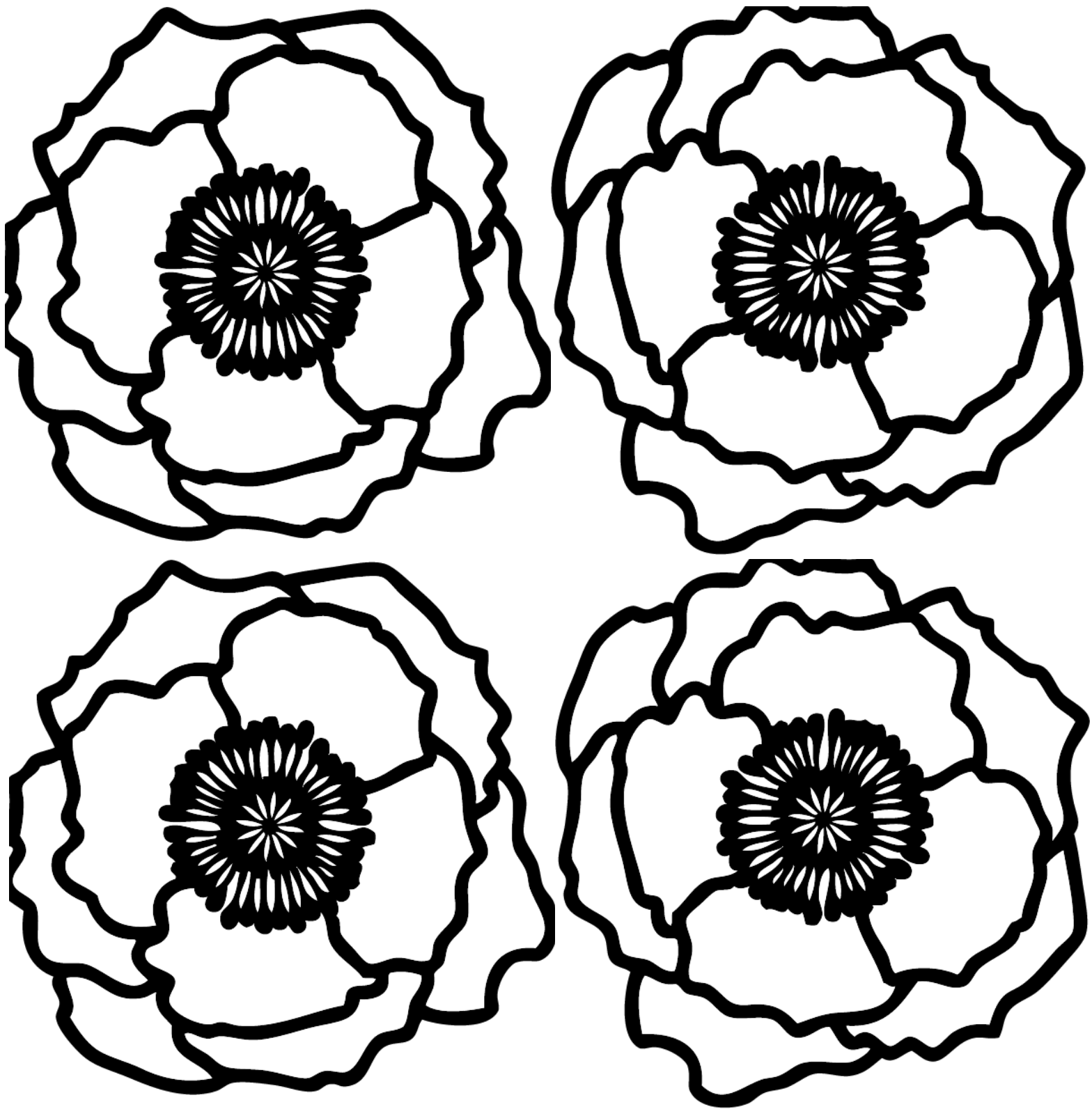


Directions for creating these poppies.

3. Mail them to Savannah.

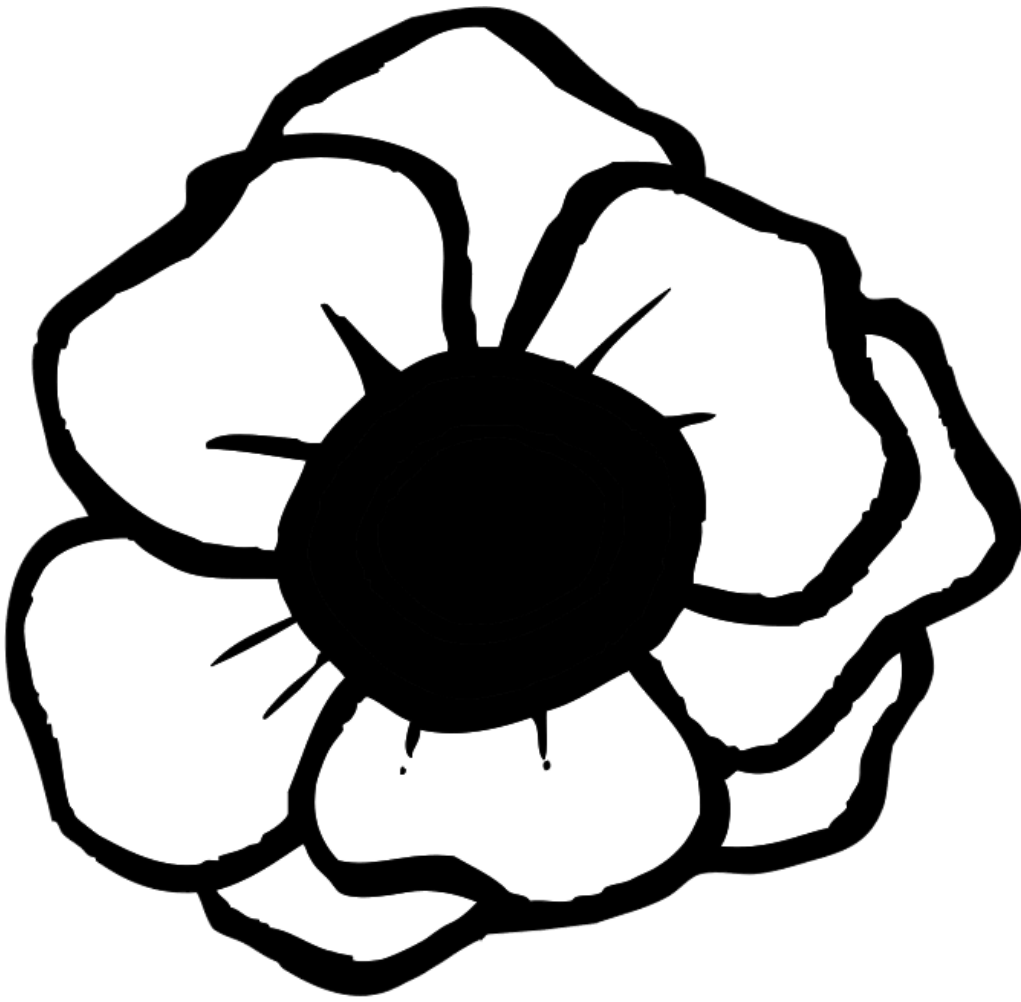

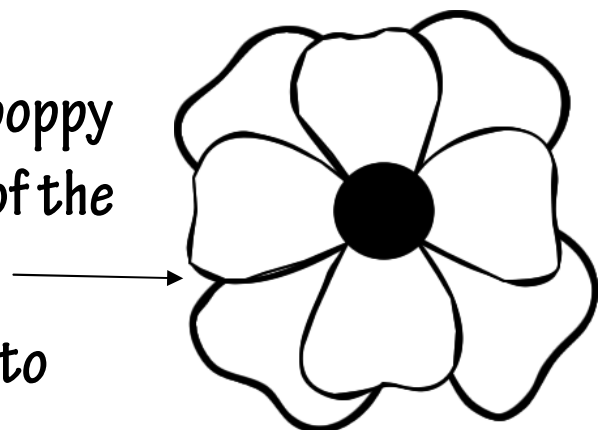


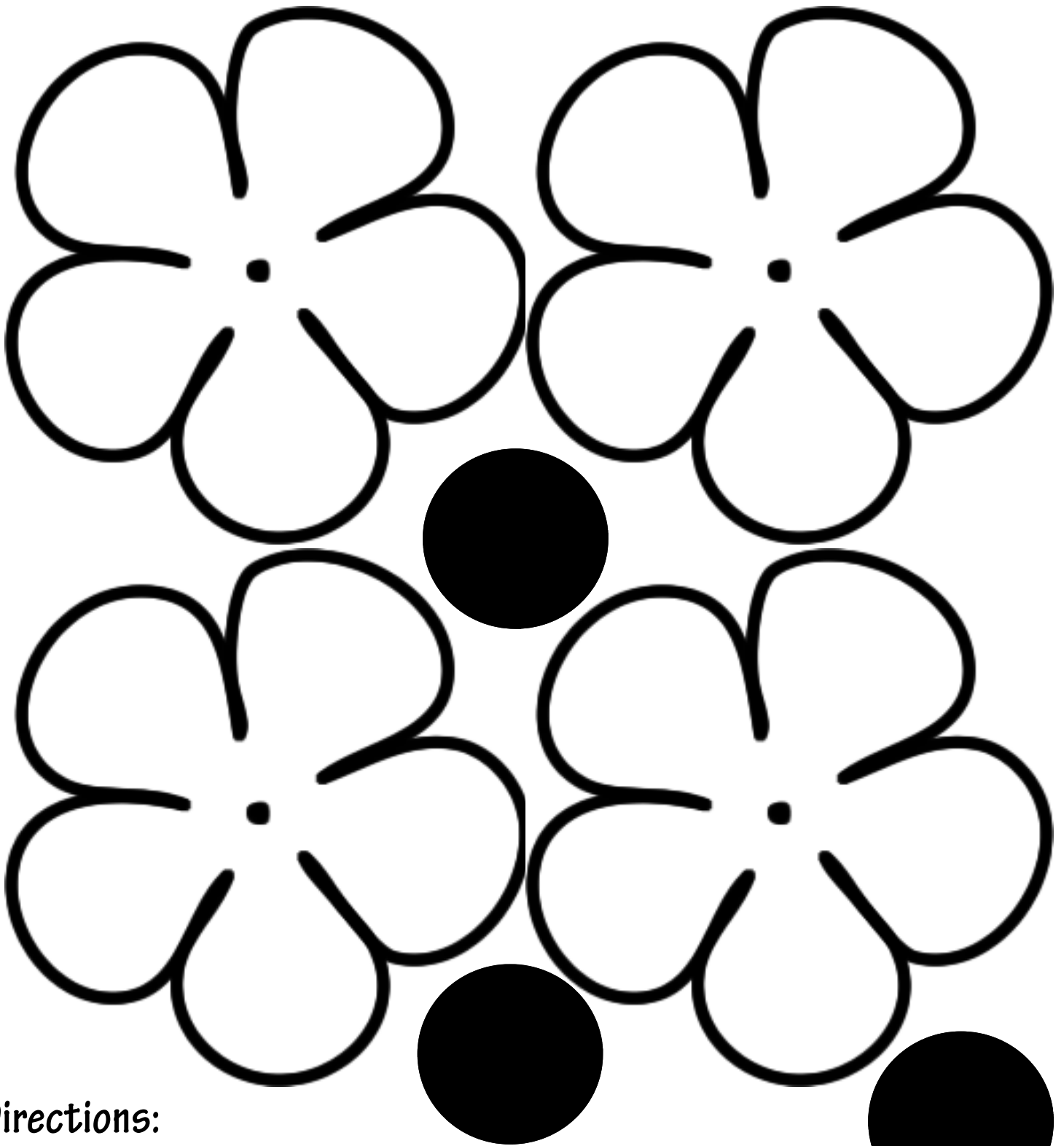
Directions for creating these poppies.

1. Color each poppy red.

2. Cut them out. Place the smaller poppy with the dot in the center on top of the larger one as shown to the right.

3. Place glue in the center and wait to dry. Mail them to Savannah.





Directions:

1. Copy this page on red paper or color them red.
2. Cut them out. Take a green pipe cleaner and poke it through underneath through the center. Fold the tip over poking out on the top with tape.
3. Glue the black dot over the green pipe cleaner.

Poppies Cupcake (liners)

Red cupcake liners (optional mini red cup liner to add layers)

Glue stick

Black circles cut out of paper (circle punch or traced on paper with water bottle cap)



Start by flattening out the paper cupcake liner in the center. Glue the mini cupcake liner inside if you are using both sizes.

Glue the black dot in the center.

Older participants can use scissors to add a flower or ruffled edge. You can also add a green straw or pipe cleaner to the back of the poppy.

Watercolor Poppies (Coffee filters)—drying time 1/2 hour

Coffee Filters

Washable red markers (Crayola™ works best)

Squirt Bottle, filled with water

Plate

Green pipe cleaners, cut a 3 inch piece off of each one



Flatten out a coffee filter on a plate. Scribble blocks of color on the filter with the red washable marker. Concentrating on the center and creating lines of color so they will flow into each other, creating a watercolor look.

Have each child take turns squirting the coffee filter with the water. Start with the center of the coffee filter and give it about 3 spritzes. Don't over wet the filter it will dull the colors of the design. You can always add more water later. You will need to let it dry at least 1/2 hour before you can finish your creation.

After it dries it poke the long piece of the pipe cleaner in the center of the coffee filter. Roll about an inch of the pipe cleaner in a tight ball so it won't fall off.

Scrunch the coffee filter around the end of the pipe cleaner.

Wrap the 3 inch piece of pipe cleaner you cut off around the coffee filter/pipe cleaner to hold them together. (as shown above) Now open your flower for display.
